Since its inception in 2006, the Organization has served hundreds of children with disabilities and their families, providing several hundred pieces of durable medical equipment. This equipment includes manual and power wheelchairs, walkers, gait trainers, standers and a host of other pieces of equipment that help children to better access their communities and better interact with their peers. "The purpose of durable medical equipment is so far beyond mobility. It's about allowing kids to be doers, not observers. This peer interaction provides enhanced development of interpersonal skills and self confidence – something that is critical to every child's development," added Kopp.

Kids Mobility Network is rapidly expanding due to increasing needs for the services provided by the Organization. Changes in medical coverage amongst many families over the past several years have increased the need for alternatives to traditional medical insurance coverage for durable medical equipment. "Our greatest challenge to date has been attaining adequate financial resources to hire the necessary staff to meet the growing demand for our services," stated Kopp. "We're actively seeking corporate sponsors and donors to help us build up Kids Mobility Network to serve the many children that require our services."
